Erhard Dietl

A Father Like Mine

Non-Fiction All Ages | 224 Pages

The portrait of an ambivalent father: Author Erhard Dietl's very personal and sometimes harrowing exploration of post-war Germany

A memoir of childhood, youth and young adulthood spent in Regensburg and Munich in the 50s, 60s and 70s. Erhard Dietl, loved by millions of children as the creator of the hilarious cult children's book characters The Ogglies, remembers his father. Like many men of his generation whose formative years were marred by war and violence, Dietl's father was curiously removed from his family – almost a stranger – yet still managed to have a huge impact on his son. Erhard Dietl sets out on a quest: who was this man – a would-be writer and photographer, well read and with many different interests but often volatile and sometimes even violent? A moving journey through time, and a touching portrait of a father-son relationship which was defined by ambivalence and distance with the very occasional moment of closeness.

His work centres on the preservation of the old forests, and he offers courses in survival training as well as camps for building log cabins.
